General Course Information

Description

This course is designed for Spanish study via authentic media and materials. Using a telenovela as the central material, students will explore topics such as identity, social class, community, and family within Hispanic cultural contexts. Through interactive activities, forum discussions, cultural analysis, and creative projects, students will develop their lexicon, communicative competence, and sociocultural understanding.

Course Learning Outcomes

1. Analyze cultural and societal themes presented in telenovelas, within the context of Spanish/Latin American societies.
2. Examine the impact of social and cultural occurrences via the lens of media narratives.
3. Compare and contrast family values and expectations in the telenovela with students' own cultural perspectives.
4. Expand vocabulary in socially and culturally relevant contexts.
5. Explore sociological and psychological concepts through practical language practice

The course is organized into five themes of weekly modules that cover specific episodes of a tv series. Activities will focus on the cultural and social themes that emerge from episode to episode. Weekly activities include website portal activities, readings and quizzes, class discussion boards, and virtual language partner conversations. Students meet virtually with the professor once at the end of the semester.
