### **General Course Information**

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#### **Description**

This course examines the transatlantic relationship, or more precisely, EU-US relations by first assessing the changing nature of the European Union and its influence in world affairs and secondly, by exploring how the evolution of the EU as a global actor has shaped the way the United States conducts its diplomacy and foreign relations with its most long standing allies both bilaterally and within the context of the EU's supranationalism and institutional capacity. Our focus will be on trade, economic and regulatory dimensions of the EU-US relationship as well as security issues within the context of NATO. We will consider the extent to which both sides of the Atlantic continue to share common values and vital shared interests and whether we are likely to see the EU and the US forge common approaches to critical global problems such as dealing with an aggressive Russia; China's growing influence, governing high risk technologies, combatting climate change, etc., or whether the relationship is destined for growing cleavages and irreconcilable differences. In either scenario, we will consider what the consequences might be for global order.

#### **Course Learning Outcomes**

Upon completion of this course, students should be able to...

- Build knowledge and understanding of the origins and current issues facing the transatlantic relationship
- Display an understanding of the structure and functioning of NATO

- Demonstrate the ability to describe the political and economic forces that shape the EU-US relationship and the global system
- Develop critical thinking and analytical skills for assessing the state of transatlantic affairs across the economic and security sectors

### **Required Course Materials**

The course readings will be uploaded to **Canvas under “Files”** and available under the **Required Readings**.

To enhance the quality of this experiential learning opportunity in the study abroad setting, it will be helpful to follow current events and the news related to developments in the EU, NATO and European politics. The best sources for staying informed about current issues in Europe for English speakers are the BBC and EuroNews websites, France 24 (English) *The Financial Times* and *The Economist*. Many articles from the latter two publications will be made available for required supplemental reading throughout the semester. For French speakers, *Le Monde* and *Le Figaro* are leading national newspapers and France Info, France Culture and France Television (TF 1, FR 2, 3 and TV 5) are other useful sources of information. Der Spiegel is a German weekly news magazine that has an international version in English for news and analysis of German, European and International Affairs, Deutsche Welle (dw.com) is 24/7 on-line and available in English.
